Four in ten people in the Ethiopian countryside don't have access to clean water. There aren't many wells, and springs and water holes are often severely contaminated. Drinking or washing with dirty water causes diseases such as diarrhoea or dangerous eye infections.

"My mother used to get ill because she drank the contaminated water. Now that the water is clean, no one gets ill any more," says Birhane, a ten-year-old girl who lives in a village in the region of Bakanisa. In Ethiopia, it falls mainly to women and girls to fetch water. They must walk to the nearest water point — which can be several hours away — and carry the heavy containers back home. Birhane fetches water in a 20-litre canister in the morning and after school. "People built a water point for us nearby," Birhane explains. "Now, we have a place where we can shower and wash our clothes."

The people who built the water scheme were from Menschen für Menschen. The aid organization, which was founded by actor Karlheinz Böhm in 1981, works with communities to create access to clean drinking water. They build hand-dug wells and spring developments which are looked after and kept clean by members of the community. A water committee, chosen by the inhabitants of the village, is trained by Menschen für Menschen to take care of the water point.

A well provides a community with a safe source of drinking water, and clean water keeps people healthy. With a well nearby, children no longer have to walk long distances to fetch water, which means they can go to school and have better chances for the future. And women have time to attend training

courses or generate income by taking part in microcredit programmes offered by Menschen für Menschen.

"When I come home from school, I play with friends and look after the cattle," says Birhane. "In the future, I want to follow the path that offers me happiness." What a difference access to clean water makes.

Find out more

One well supplies approximately 200 people with clean water. In Ethiopia, every person's daily water usage is about 20 litres. In comparison, in Germany, every person uses about 121 litres per day.
